Note	<p>Il ciclo di incontri sarà in inglese.</p> <p><b>Abstract del modulo: Artivism and Female Empowerment</b></p> <p>Artivism is defined as the act of employing art to promote a political agenda. Artivists use their art to create awareness, develop critical reflection, and encourage audience to re-envision reality. Therefore it is instrumental in the transformation of the collective imagination. In the past decade, the MENA region has witnessed the rise of different forms of artivism where art and activism have joined forces to create new platforms for social change. Women artivists have engaged with these platforms to break away from traditional notions of self-representation and present alternative gender imagery that is inclusive of marginalized women voices and histories. Their work projects a concern with gender issues that stems in many cases from personal stories which they attempt to translate into shared experiences with their audience.</p>

In this course, students will study different forms of creative and artistic practices by women activists, and the extent to which they re-envision gender power dynamics. Examples of activist practices will include both literary and popular culture production by women writers, cartoonists, vloggers, rappers, female comedy bands, etc, representing different parts of the MENA region. Students will have a chance to reflect upon various activist practices and how they offer a different reading of the cultural history of the Arab region that rejects the dominant discourse on women and substitutes it with a more liberating and celebratory outlook on gender.
