To be admitted to the the Master's Degree Programme in Languages and Cultures of Asia and Africa, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- at least 18 ECTS credits in the language of Asia and Africa to be studied at advanced level;
- at least 12 ECTS credits in historical and or cultural subjects related to the area of the first Asian or African language studied (to verify whether your qualifications meet these requirements, it is recommended to contact the Programme Coordinator before submitting your application);
- at least 6 ECTS credits in a European Union language.

For the MAA/3 curriculum, a sound knowledge of English is required, demonstrated either through university coursework (minimum 12 ECTS credits) or a recognized B2-level (or higher) English language certificate, as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

If there is a partial lack of credits in the language of Asia or Africa to be studied at advanced level, the Admissions Committee may evaluate any officially recognized language certificates in the Asian or African language the student intends to study. In such cases, the Committee reserves the right to assess the certificates and verify the applicant's language proficiency through an interview prior to admission. In case of a partial lack of credits in the historical-cultural disciplines related to the area of the Asian or African language to be studied at advanced level, or if the Committee deems it necessary, supplementary study materials will be assigned and verified through an interview prior to admission.

Furthermore, credits earned by enrolling in a single course to fill any missing ECTS credits may also be recognized.

Only for Curriculum 1 (Lingue e Letterature) and for justified reasons evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the Admissions Committee, it is possible to undertake the study of a second Oriental or African language at a beginner level, provided that this contributes to the student's educational development and the attainment of advanced preparation both in methodologies and linguistic theories.

The verification of eligibility requirements is carried out by the Admissions Committee, which also evaluates the curriculum vitae et studiorum and the study plan intended to be followed over the two years.
