Master's Degree Course: ARCHAEOLOGY: ASIA, AFRICA AND MEDITERRANEAN

Program Overview

The primary objective of this Master's Degree Course is to train archaeologists and specialists in past cultures with a solid understanding of the historical contexts in which these cultures emerged. Students are encouraged to deepen their knowledge of archaeological theories, methods, and practices across the African, Asian, and Mediterranean regions. A distinctive feature of the program is its integrated approach to these geographical areas, with particular emphasis on networks of cultural and material exchange.

The broad and flexible curriculum enables students to design academic paths spanning specific regions (Asia, Africa, Mediterranean) and cultural-historical periods (prehistoric, protohistoric and historic times, the Classical world, Late Antiquity, Islamic cultures etc.). Alongside theoretical instruction, students acquire essential technical skills for the interpretation and analysis of archaeological data. Special attention is devoted to professional development through laboratory work and internships.

Career Opportunities

Graduates will emerge as qualified experts in archaeology and museum heritage, capable of working internationally as researchers, technical specialists, excavation supervisors, museum professionals, cultural event organizers, and editorial contributors. They may find employment in public institutions, private companies, and cultural cooperatives engaged in research, protection, promotion, and dissemination of cultural heritage, both nationally and internationally.

The program also provides a strong foundation for advanced academic pursuits, including doctoral programs in archaeology and related disciplines, as well as Italy's postgraduate Schools of Specialization in Archaeology.. Through hands-on learning experiences such as laboratory activities and internships, students accumulate certified training hours that support eligibility for inclusion in the national registry of cultural heritage professionals (as outlined in Ministerial Decree 244/2019).

Curriculum 3 - ARCHAEOLOGY: NETWORKS OF EXCHANGE

The new English-language curriculum *Archaeology: Networks of Exchange* (MAC/3), offers a more interdisciplinary perspective than the two curricula already offered in Italian: *Archeologie del Mediterraneo* (MAC/1) and *Archeologie dell'Asia e dell'Africa* (MAC/2).

The MAC/3 English curriculum focuses on the dynamics of contact, exchange, and reciprocal adaptation among ancient cultures. It adopts both a trans-areal perspective and an intra-regional approach, occasionally including reflections on modern legacies.

Courses will be taught by faculty with expertise in various geographical and cultural contexts, reflecting the inter- and trans-disciplinary ethos at the heart of MAC/3. This approach will encourage engagement with cross-cutting themes—such as settlement patterns and architectural models, production technologies, human-environment interaction, religious and philosophical systems, and research methodologies—examined through their development over time and across regions.

The structure of MAC/3 aligns with the general framework defined by the Ministry of University and Research. Like MAC/1 and MAC/2, it is organized into thematic areas grouping specific disciplinary fields and includes the following components:

- **12 exams** (each worth 6 ECTS/CFU credits), including **2 free choice courses**, which may be selected from other Master's programs at 'L'Orientale';
- **Other Educational Activities** (totaling 24 ECTS/CFU), such as hands-on labs and methodological seminars, are designed to build skills relevant to the professional fields.
- **1 Internship** (150 hours, 6 ECTS/CFU), to be undertaken at institutions, organizations, or companies engaged in the research, preservation, and management of cultural heritage;
- **Final Examination** (18 ECTS/CFU), based on a thesis to be defended before an academic committee.
